

Cafe Justicia Green Bean Price List - 2022-23

Café Justicia beans are produced in the Atitlán region of Guatemala by members of the Campesino Committee of the Highlands (CCDA). The coffee is imported and marketed in Canada on behalf of the CCDA by Café Justicia Canada, a volunteer-run non-profit. 100% of profits are returned to Guatemala to support development projects with the CCDA and other community groups. The CCDA's 2021-22 crop of Cafe Justicia scored an impressive 86.38 in cupping by Guatemala's National Coffee Association.

- 1. CCDA transitional coffee is grown without chemical pesticides, herbicides, and fertilizers, but has not yet achieved organic certification.
- 2. The organic coffee is NOP and COR certified
- Prices quoted are FOB. Pick up at the **Eland SCS coffee warehouse** at 5040 Timberlea Blvd., Mississauga, ON, L4W 2S5, (905) 792-0500.
- Eland requires 72 hours' notice for a regular pick up. Cut off time is 2 PM Eastern. Rush orders can be processed for a surcharge. Pallets charges are as follows: 72 hours = \$65, 48 hours = \$75, 24 hours = \$85. (Plus HST).
- Eland requires shippers to present a pickup number and consignee's name and destination when picking up orders.
- Eland charges a \$75 minimum handling fee. (Plus HST)
- Payment can be made by e-transfer (preferred) or sent by cheque or money order to Café Justicia and mailed to the address above. We can also process credit card payments, but there is a 1.3% surcharge. To pay by credit card, please let us know when you order so we can activate the option on your invoice.
